SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT:

1. See Information to the Board.
2. NJQSAC.
3. Graduating student in IB program received 20 semester credits upon entering college.
4. District Facebook will be available very soon.
5. Test scores have improved. School #4 made safe harbor in both literacy and math.
6. There are a number of initiatives this year:
 - a) We will continue with the IB program at the high school.
 - b) We joined a math consortium at the middle school level with Rutgers University.
 - c) Over the summer, several of our teachers attended American History professional development at Princeton.
 - d) We continue with Merck and our science program.

- e) The Tools of the Mind initiative will be brought to the kindergarten level this year, as well as pre-k where it was introduced last year. NYU will be conducting a study where half of the kindergarten classes will have Tools of the Mind and the other half will continue with what we had last year. NYU will pay for all materials and training.
 - f) The E-Map program will allow students to set up a business and go out and sell advertising space all with the idea of raising money for student activities.
 - g) Last month an agreement was approved to be the first school in the United States to become the Great Wall Model Chinese Program which means they will set up curriculum and train teachers.
 - h) Over the summer, Dr. Tomazic traveled to the Dominican Republic with Friends Beyond Borders. On his first night there, he happened to mention to other educators that it would be nice to finish strategic guidance that the Department of State had given to K-12 education, which is that it is in the strategic interest of the United States to learn Russian, Chinese and Arabic. Since Russian and Chinese are already taught in Linden, he would like to introduce Arabic at no cost to the taxpayers. One fellow educator said she was a consultant to the Emir of Qatar and that she would try to help us out.
 - i) One main initiative of the upcoming school year is to plan for the following school year to see if we can once and for all get all of our elementary schools to be pre-k through five. The means to make this happen will be the 21 new classrooms at School #2. We will work very closely with the Educational Support Team and parents.
 - j) We need to plan for the future of the high school building. Dr. Tomazic would like to begin meaningful discussions about the very definite steps that need to be taken. The building is old and will not last in the condition it's in right now.
