## School Wide Monthly Letter Writing Event at School No. 5!

<b>September 26</b>	To kick off the program, students will write letters to their parents welcoming them to Back to School Night which is on September 24th!
<b>October 15</b>	Fire Prevention Week is October 7th through October 13th. Students are to write letters based on this writing prompt: Write to a friend about a few different ways you learned to stay safe during a fire.
<b>November 12</b>	Students will write letters to staff members in honor of American Education Week and National Career Week! Students will thank staff members for their services.
<b>December 14</b>	Students are to write letters based on this writing prompt: Would you rather live in a place that gets a lot of snow or a place that has no snow at all? Explain.
<b>January 10</b>	Students are to write letters based on this writing prompt: Two goals that I have for the new year are...
<b>February 13</b>	Students are to write letters based on this writing prompt: Imagine that you were the President of the United States of America. Write about a law that you would want to have to make America a better place to live.
<b>March 1</b>	To celebrate National Read Across America Day, (Dr. Seuss Day), students will identify their favorite book and write letters to each other about it. Students should encourage their "pen-pal" to write back about their favorite book.
<b>April 11</b>	Students are to write letters based on this writing prompt: Imagine that someone gave you 1 MILLION DOLLARS. Write about ways you could use that money to help people that are in need.
<b>May 6</b>	To celebrate Teacher Appreciation Week, students will honor teachers by writing letters to thank them for making a positive impact on their lives.
